[NOVA] How do I cancel/delete orders?

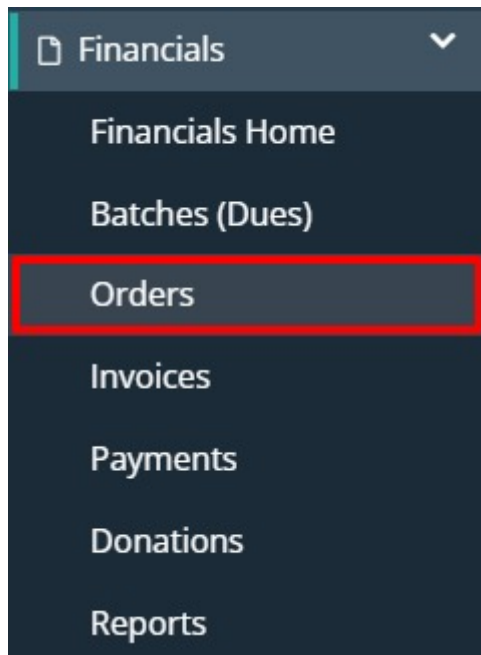

Orders can be cancelled and deleted within ClubRunner if you're looking to remove them from the account. This would cancel or delete the associated invoices that were issued in relation to the order, and adjust the associated member's account balance.

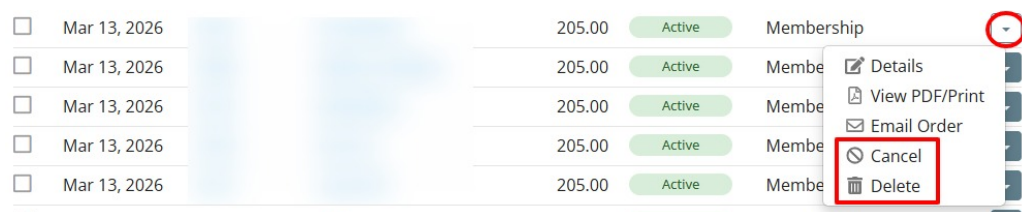
Note

Orders that contain invoices with transactions cannot be deleted. Deleted orders cannot be restored.

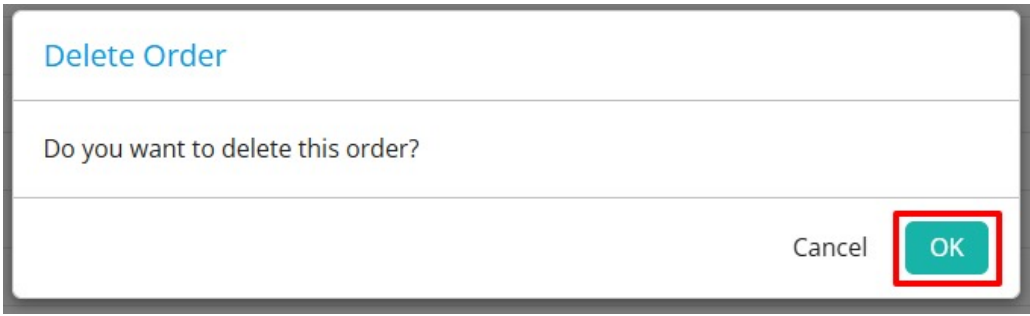
1. Log in to your account through your club homepage, then click on **Member Area** on the top right under your club banner. [Alternatively, click here to go directly to the ClubRunner login page.](#)
2. On the left-hand menu, click the arrow next to **Financials**, then click on **Orders**.



3. You can cancel or delete an order directly from the order list screen by **clicking on the arrow** in the right-hand column, then selecting **Cancel** or **Delete**.



Confirm the selection in the prompt that follows to delete or cancel the order.



4. Alternatively, you can open an order and cancel or delete it from there. Either click on the **order number**, or **click on the arrow** in the right-hand column and select **Details**.
